


**Dear Friends and Supporters,**

## About the Organization



Girganga Parivar Trust is a registered grassroots nonprofit working to address the water crisis in Saurashtra, Gujarat through decentralized, nature-based water conservation efforts. The Trust is legally registered under the Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 with Registration No. E/10593/Rajkot, dated 30th March 2017.

Founded by Mr. Dilipbhai Sakhiya, a visionary grassroots leader and former President of the District Kisan Sangh (Rajkot), the Trust was born from his deep understanding of rural farmers' water-related challenges. His decades of field experience and unwavering commitment to sustainable farming led to the inception of this people-led water movement. Recognizing the urgency of groundwater depletion and recurring droughts, he initiated this mission to secure every drop of rainwater for future generations.

Though registered in 2017, Girganga Parivar Trust accelerated its impact, expanding its reach to 10 Districts, 35 blocks and nearly 600 villages across Gujarat by end of the year 2024-25. The Trust has implemented over 4000 water conservation structures, directly benefiting thousands of farmers and revitalizing vast stretches of agricultural land.

## Annual Achievement Summary



During FY 2024–25, Girganga Parivar Trust scaled its water security mission across Saurashtra and neighboring regions. A total of 2,316 water structures were implemented, covering 7 districts, 16 talukas, and 286 Gram Panchayats, directly benefiting over 62,900 rural citizens.

The majority of works focused on check-dam construction and lake rejuvenation (2,245 structures), ensuring long-term irrigation and groundwater recharge. In addition, 71 bore wells were scientifically recharged, strengthening drinking water and irrigation sources for small farming households.

Collectively, these interventions contributed to improved groundwater levels, enhanced crop productivity, and restored water resilience for vulnerable communities.

## Core Activities Implemented

 **Water structure = 2,316**

 **Beneficiaries = 62,931**

 **Coverage = 7 Districts, 16 Talukas, 286 GPs**

## Cumulative Impact:

- Revived approximately 1.88 Lakh acres of agricultural land
- Raised groundwater levels in semi-critical zones
- Directly benefited nearly 63,000 farmers and livestock rearing communities
- Promoted local ownership of water resources through training and awareness.

## Impact Stories

*Restoring Hope through Water: Bhavnagar Villages Revived*

Villages like Todi, Kharachiya, Ratanpar, and Jilvana in Sihor taluka of Bhavnagar district suffered from deep water crises. In 2024, GGPT rejuvenated long-forgotten check-dams just before monsoon.

Highlights:

- Check-dams filled after first rainfall
- Borewells yielding water at just 20 feet
- Drinking water restored 24/7
- Tanker dependence ended
- Wells and cattle sources revived

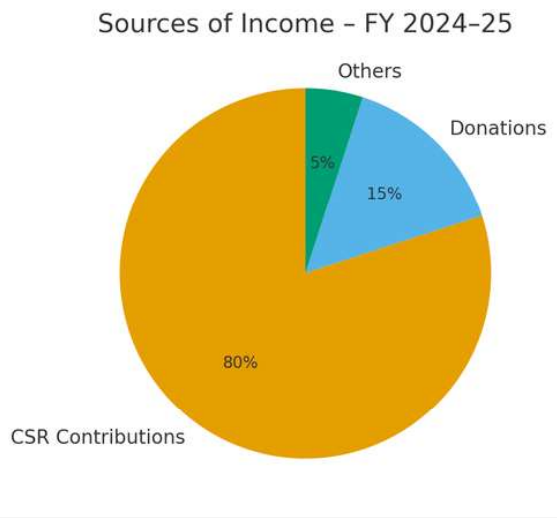
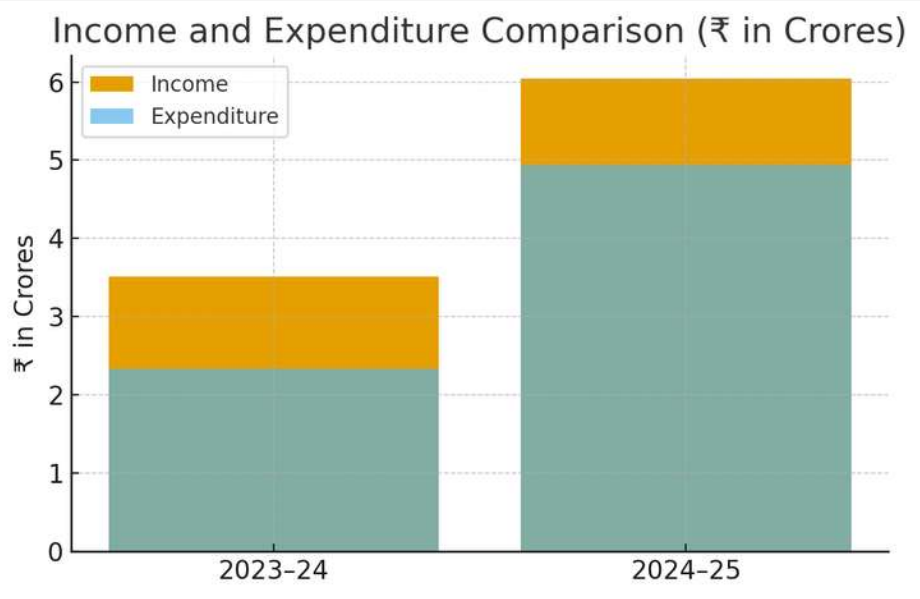




## Audited Financial Statements – FY 2024–25
